



Professor Mario Santana Quintero has contributed to the conservation of precious World Heritage sites worldwide through his innovative digital documentation methods. He is co-chair of the UNESCO Chair on Digital Twins for World Heritage Conservation. He holds cross-appointments in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering and the Azrieli School of Architecture and Urbanism, both within the Faculty of Engineering and Design at Carleton University. He is also a faculty member at the Carleton Immersive Media Studio (CIMS).

In addition to his academic work in Canada, he served as the immediate past Secretary-General of the International Council of Monuments and Sites (ICOMOS), member of the Association for Preservation Technology College of Fellows, Doctorate Honoris Causa from the University of Liège (Belgium), and is one of the Honorary Presidents of the ICOMOS Scientific Committee on Heritage Documentation (CIPA). He has collaborated on numerous international heritage documentation initiatives with institutions such as the Getty Conservation Institute and UNESCO.

He recently completed a fellowship at the International Centre for the Interpretation and Presentation of World Heritage Sites (WHIPIC), where he continues to advance inclusive and ethical approaches to heritage interpretation.
